






*This document is one example of how instruction can be divided to include all components of literacy. It is fluid in contrast to a block schedule.*





Whole Group Literacy Instruction can be organized in any sequence that best meets student needs and class schedule.

	<p align="center"><b>Read Aloud</b> <b>1 text</b></p> <p>A planned oral reading of a book or print excerpt, usually related to a theme or topic of study</p>	<p><b>Examples:</b> Exemplar Text Picture Book Chapter Book Poem</p>
	<p align="center"><b>Shared Reading</b></p> <p><b>All students have access to the same text</b> An interactive reading experience that occurs when students join in or share the reading of a text with guidance and support from the teacher</p>	<p><b>Examples:</b> Multiple copies of the same text Digital text (LCD projection) Poems Speeches Excerpts of Texts</p>

	<p><b>Quick Writes</b> A five to seven minute writing opportunity for students to write in response to a prompt that sparks an idea.</p>	<p><b>Example Prompts:</b> YouTube clips Images Music/Songs Stories Poems</p>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Small Group</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Lessons are based on student data</b></p> <p>The teacher provides support for small groups of readers as they learn to use various reading strategies. The teacher also scaffolds readers as they interact with grade level text.</p>	<p><b>Examples:</b></p> <p>Multiple copies of grade level texts Multiple copies of excerpts of exemplar texts</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Independent Practice</b></p> <p>Opportunities for students to practice skills at an independent level.</p>	<p><b>Examples:</b></p> <p>Work Stations <i>SuccessMaker</i> Independent Reading</p>
