

KINDERGARTEN

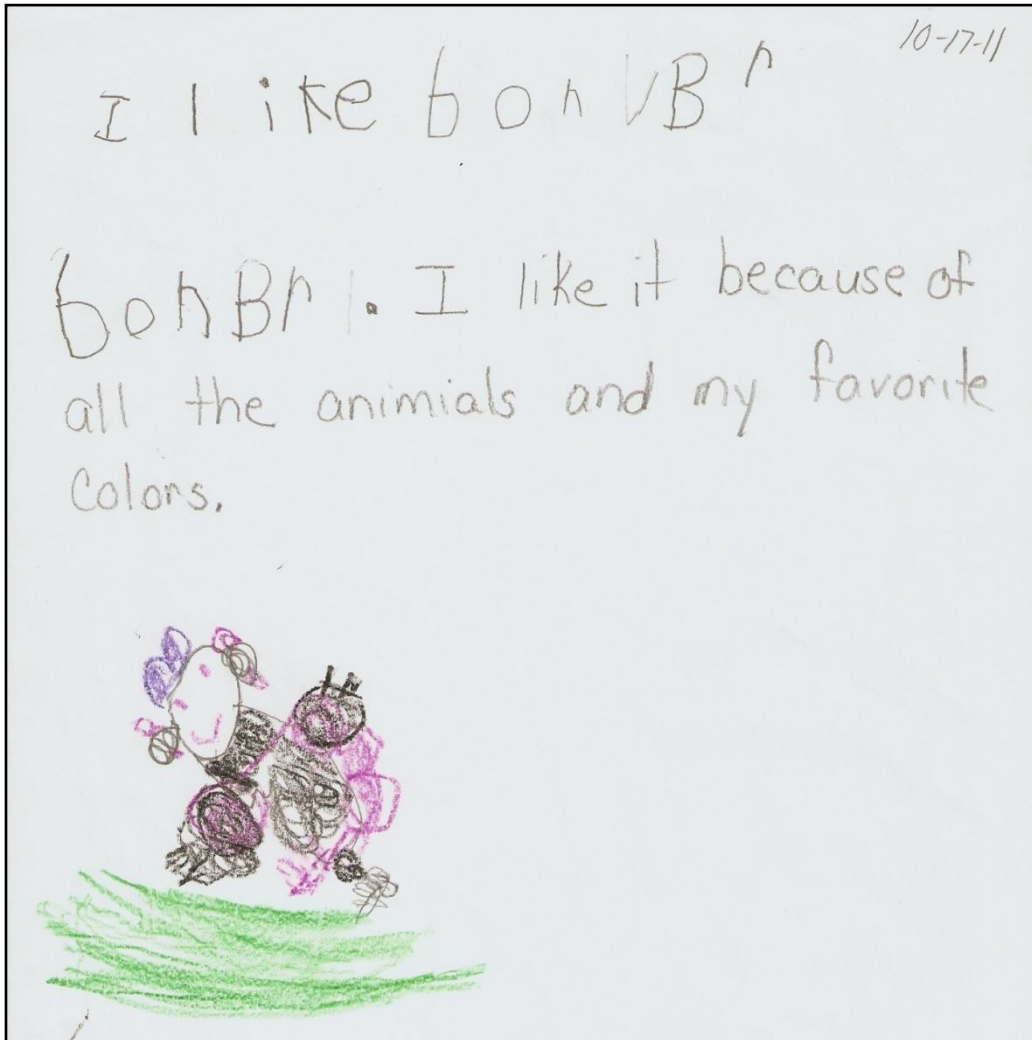

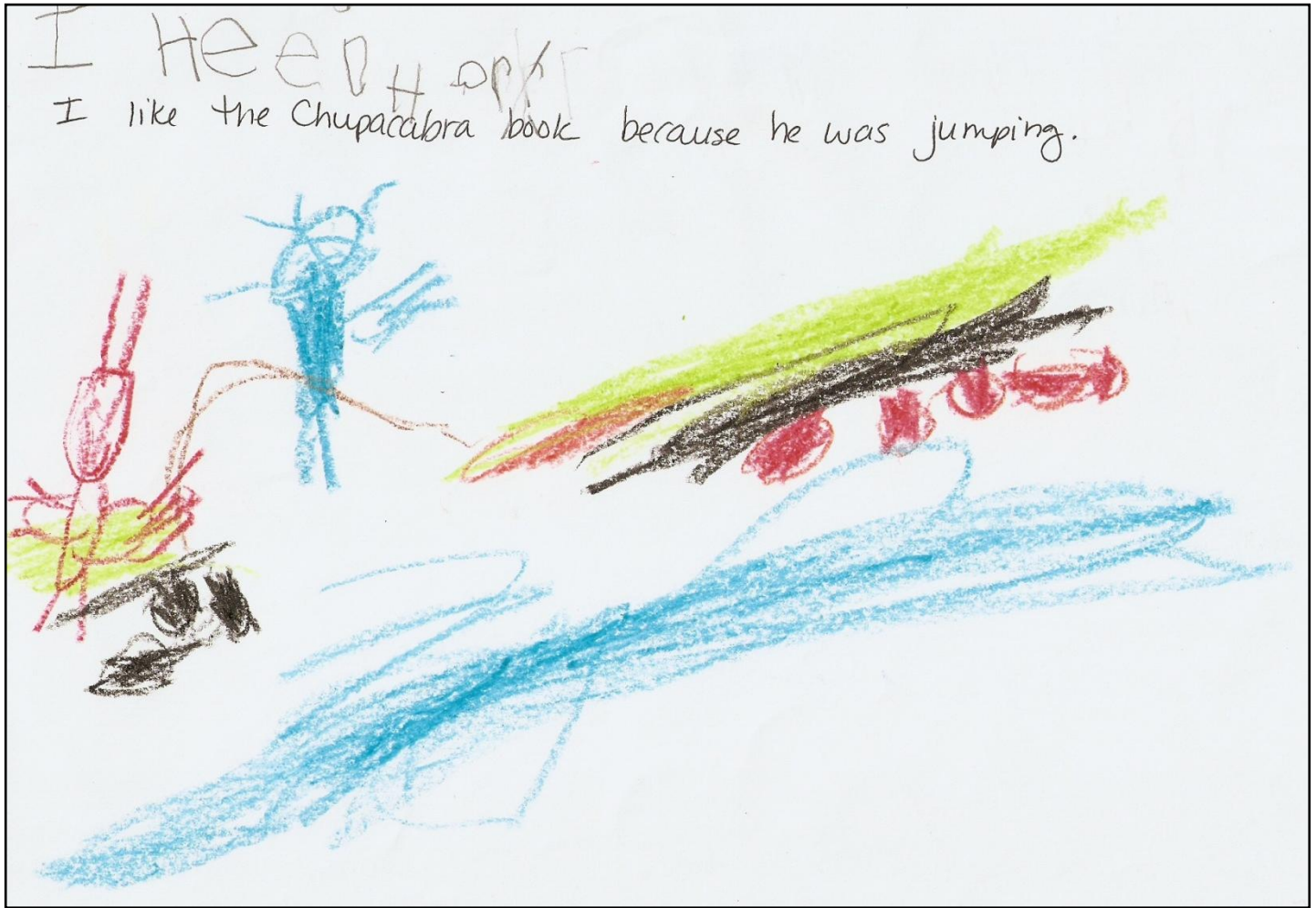


Annotation

1st Quarter Kindergarten Samples of Proficient Writing



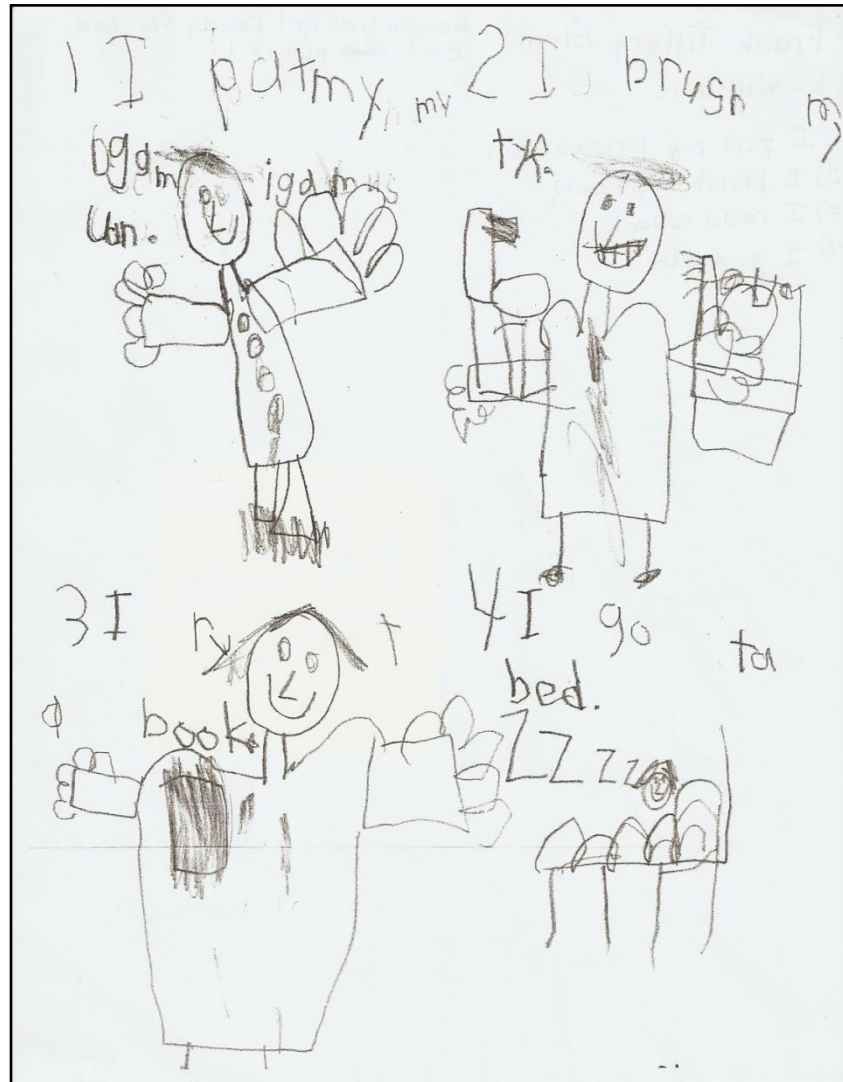
Annotation

1st Quarter Kindergarten Samples of Proficient Writing

W.K.2 Use a combination of drawing, dictating, and writing to compose informative/explanatory texts in which they name what they are writing about and supply some information about the topic.



Annotation

The writer of this piece

- uses a combination of drawing, and writing.

Prompt- How do you get ready for bed each night?

1. I put my pajamas on.
2. I brush my teeth
3. I read a book.
4. I go to bed.

- supplies information about the topic.
