

KINDERGARTEN

This is a collection of writing samples collected from kindergarten students at the end of the third quarter of 2011-2012. Teachers were asked to submit *point in time* examples of proficient performance of the kindergarten writing standards.

Although the style, sentence formation, usage, and mechanics covered in the language standards were considered, the primary focus for selection was the content covered in the writing standards. Annotations are included.



W.K.1. Use a combination of drawing, dictating, and writing to compose opinion pieces in which they tell a reader the topic or the name of the book they are writing about and state an opinion or preference about the topic or book (e.g., My favorite book is...)




Annotation

Meanies By drop The Nea gross were.


Annotation


- uses a combination of drawing, and writing

 - ... has a lot of feathers. It has strong talons. It is a symbol.



- narrates a several loosely linked events and the events in the order they occurred
 - My dad caught a football sized fish.
 - Two of them were making noise.
 - I did not catch a fish.
 - And my brother caught a catfish.
- provides a reaction to what happened
 - It was not fair to me.

W.K.5 With guidance and support from adults, focus on a topic, respond to questions and suggestions from peers, and add details to strengthen writing as needed.

 - I like the Eagle because it has a big beak and it has wings.






- used a digital tool to publish their writing


W.K.7 Participate in shared research and writing projects.

 - I like Rio because I like the birds and I like their colors and they speak Portuguese.



 - Groundhogs have sharp teeth and snakes can eat babies sometimes.

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
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

W.K.8 With guidance and support from adults, recall information from experiences or gather information from provided sources to answer a question.




Annotation
