Oral Language

- Participate in conversations

- Follow words from left to right, top to bottom and page by page
- Recognize and name some upper and lowercase letters of the alphabet
- Recognize and produce rhyming words (listening, no print)
- Count syllables in spoken words (listening, no print)
- Identify initial sounds in words (listening, no print)

Comprehension

- Ask and answer questions about key details in a text
- Listen and respond to stories
- Identify the front cover, back cover, and the title page of a book
- Use words to describe objects in categories

Writing

- Tell stories, explain or state an opinion by:
 - o Drawing pictures
 - O Dictating words, phrases and sentences
 - O Using knowledge of letters and sounds to write
