








This document is one example of how instruction can be divided to include all components of literacy. It is fluid in contrast to a block schedule.




Whole Group Literacy Instruction can be organized in any sequence that best meets student needs and class schedule.

	Shared Reading All students have access to the same text An interactive reading experience that occurs when students join in or share the reading of a text with guidance and support from the teacher	Examples: Multiple copies of the same text Digital text (LCD projection) Poems Speeches Excerpts of Texts
